

Dual Credit

- What is dual credit?
 - An opportunity for high school students to enroll in college courses and receive high school graduation credit and college credit for the same courses simultaneously.
- What courses are eligible?
 - Those in the <u>core curriculum</u> of the public institution of higher education providing the credit;
 - a career and technical education course; or
 - a <u>foreign language</u> course.



Dual Credit Benefits

- Saves money and time
- Gain college level experience
- Stand out on university admissions applications
- Increases the likelihood that a student will complete both their high school and college education





Dual Credit Benefits

- Course credit is not dependent on a single exam
- Lowers the amount of student loan debt
- Students enter the workforce sooner
- Complete core curriculum for degree requirements
- Complete technical certificates or earn an Associates degree

FAST (Financial Aid for Swift Transfer)

- FAST is a new financial aid program for students who have qualified for free/reduced lunch in any of the four school years prior to the academic year in which they enroll in dual credit.
- Students who qualify for the FAST program will be eligible to take dual credit coursework at no cost.



Dual Credit Payment Options

- Students can pay their bill online by logging into MySPC, view their Texan Connect Card and select "View and Pay My Bill".
- Students also have the option to set up a payment plan.
- Students may also call the Business Office at (806) 716-2400 to pay in full with a debit/credit card. Students are also welcome to pay in-person at any SPC campus with cash, card or check.
- Student who qualify, may also use the following benefits:
 - Tuition waivers issued by the state of Texas
 - Students who qualify through the Hazlewood Act



Degree Plan Requirements

- 42 hours of mandatory core curriculum.
- Career and Technical Education (CTE) courses available will apply to a certificate or Associate of Applied Science.
- Students can earn up to 60 hours applicable to either an Associate of Arts or an Associate of Science degree.

Dual Credit Admission Steps

- Complete SPC Admission Application at: <u>https://apply.southplainscollege.edu</u>
- Meet with High School Counselor to determine courses, then counselor will notify SPC of student's course selection
- Submit unofficial High School Transcript. (Submitted once, when you initially enroll in dual credit courses)
- Submit Qualifying Test Scores
- Submit official college transcript(s) for colleges attended other than South Plains College.

*Be a non-degree seeking student who has not earned over 15 college credit hours.
